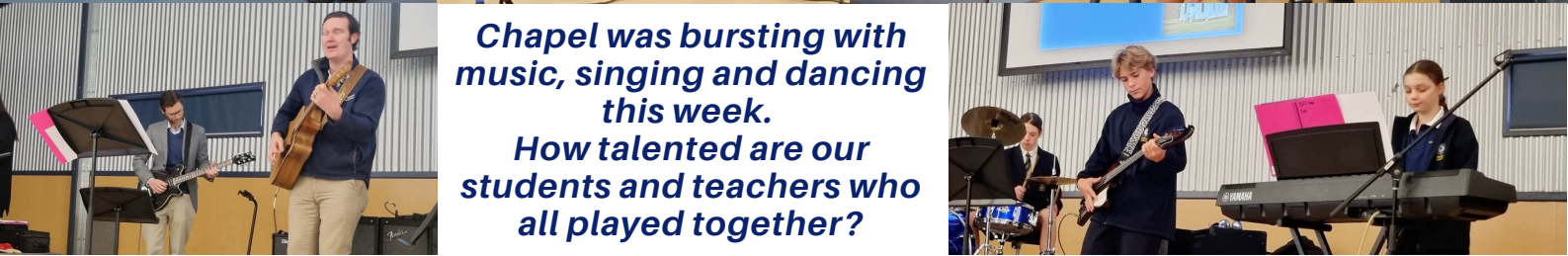
If you are blessed enough to have a mother in your life - they are words you hopefully used on Sunday. Chances are though you will have heard them from your mother many more times than you have used them.
