This Week's Message HARD TO BELIEVE!



I started supporting the South Adelaide Football Club in the SANFL the day I was born - thanks to my dad. As a young lad it taught me how to accept losing - we lost often, and quite badly, and it also taught me about being loyal to a team. Dad took me week after week to watch them get flogged - but I remained loyal and optimistic. Something changed in 1977. Haydn Bunton who started coaching two years before suddenly started to get results. We made the finals for the first time in 11 years. In 1979 South made it all the way to the Grand Final - I have still not forgiven Port Adelaide to this day for beating us, I was shattered. I was sure I was doomed to spend my life never supporting a premiership team. Indeed, South still haven't won a premiership since 1964 despite the odd spirited "cameo" in the finals.

The arrival of the Adelaide Crows gave me new hope! In 1993 in only their third season the Crows were 7 goals up on Essendon at half time. Tony Modra our star full-forward had 5 goals already. This was going to be our year - we would be playing Carlton in the Grand Final the next week.

THUMP! An 11 goal to 2 last half by Essendon meant we lost by 2 goals. The football doldrums continued. A team I support winning a Grand Final - Hard to Believe!!!!!



Well things changed in 1997. The Crows played St Kilda and in a tight contest kicked away in the final 5 minutes of the game. I remember mentally knowing that there wasn't possibly time to lose - but being too scared to think we could and were going to actually win - Hard to Believe!!!! The Crows were underdogs but some how won again. I remember the exact same thoughts and that it was "Hard to Believe!!"

Patterns that I developed barracking for South Adelaide and then the early years of the Crows coming to the 'fore' again. Teams I barrack for don't win - surely they will lose. It still continues today. Looking back the Crows Premierships even now are "Hard to Believe"!

God tells me He loves me no matter what. He forgives me and He has each of my days under control. My struggle sometimes lies in the thinking from past experiences and the messages of today's world which can lead me to doubting Gods promises. These subtle thoughts and messages can tell us that we need to make things happen and that the outcomes of our day can rely totally on us and our own strength. In the busyness of life, it can be hard to believe that God is actually the one in control and that we should be leaning on Him.

At Maitland Lutheran School we want everyone to believe and have confidence in God's promises to us. Unlike footy teams He is trustworthy and dependable when we lean on Him.

That is what "We do Believe".



The Year 1/2 class have been exploring light and sound as part of their IC unit.
Students explored how light travels with different materials identifying if materials were opaque, translucent or transparent.






Light has also been a focus in Yr 11Ag Science with an experiment to see how coloured light affects plant growth. The students are observing plants under blue, red and yellow cellophane. So far, the plants under the red cellophane are growing faster than the others.


