STAGE 1 LEGAL STUDIES

On Wednesday of Week 4 our Stage One Legal Studies class had the opportunity to visit the courts in Adelaide in preparation for their upcoming 'Mock Trial' assessment, where the students each take on the persona of a judge, lawyer, witness or accused in a fake traffic violation case. Students had the chance to see summary cases in the Magistrates Court, including minor traffic violations, as well as minor indictable offences in the District Court, including aggravated robbery. They were able to observe the proceedings and trial processes, learn about courtroom etiquette and see how lawyers, judges and sheriffs dress, speak and act. The students were particularly impressed with the architecture of the buildings, and of course with the judge's wigs.




