FIRST AID

On the 28th of November, a group of students from years 10 and 11 chose to undertake the opportunity of completing a certified first aid course.

As part of the course, we learnt and demonstrated how to deal with various medical emergencies, such as the recovery position, CPR for all ages, treatment for snake and spider bites and finally how to safely and efficiently manage someone with asthma and anaphylaxis.

Prior to the practical training, we also completed 4 hours of online theory as an introduction to the course.

Some of the student's favourite parts of the course included: <u>Oscar</u>: I enjoyed learning how to put someone in the recovery position and completing the overall course.

<u>Macushla</u>: My favourite part of the course was learning how to properly assist a snake and spider bite. <u>Sophie</u>: I especially enjoyed the CPR side of the course, specifically learning the difference between various ages from infants, children and adults.

Angus & Jude: We enjoyed completing the overall course, specifically learning CPR and how to use a defibrillator. Jason: I really enjoyed working with my peers and learning new skills that are beneficial in the real world.



















YEAR 1/2 & YEAR 2 EXCURSION

On Friday the 17th of November, the year 1/2 and year 2 classes travelled to the Moonta Railway and Museum as part of our Integrated Curriculum studies. Each class enjoyed a train ride around the heritage mining area, learning about the process of mining copper which happened there one hundred years ago (1862-1923). At the Moonta Mine Museum, each class also had the opportunity to walk through the 14 rooms including displays related to the Cornish miners' lifestyles, war memorabilia and sit in a furnished olden day classroom. YEAR 4 - SYMMETRY



The Year 4 class have been exploring symmetry. We have learnt about rotational symmetry and have completed a range of tasks to create our own artworks using reflection and symmetry.

Highlights of the unit include investigating the question of 'How might we use digital tools to help us make our drawings symmetrical'. Students drew a pattern on the template and then scanned it to their email. They then copied and pasted it and used the rotate feature to create rotational symmetry artwork.

Our next task included pancakes and lollies! Students had to draw a design using reflection and symmetry and then got to put their design onto a pancake! Thanks to community member Cheryle Schwartz for making the pancakes and helping out with the learning experience.











YEAR 5 - CHEMICAL CHANGES

In Integrated Curriculum this term the Year 5's have been learning about changes in matter. This week we had the opportunity to observe chemical changes thanks to Mr Anderson and his amazing science experiments. We observed that when there is a chemical change in matter it can create - gas - heat - colour changes - sound and odors. This was a really fun and entertaining way to see our learning in a very real way right in front of us!

SCHOOL BUS NEWS

New buses have arrived!

We have recently taken delivery of some new buses as part of our bus replenishment program.



New additions to our school bus fleet include three low-km, second-hand Daewoo buses and one new Australian-designed bus, a Challenger V12. You may notice them soon on our daily school runs. These buses will lower the average age of our bus fleet, improving reliability and reducing maintenance demands. They will also be popular with our student-passengers, providing comfort beyond what some of our older buses were able to do. The new buses will give us the opportunity to retire some of our older and less-reliable buses.

SOME NEW FACES IN THE BUS TEAM!

We have some new team members who are helping us keep our buses on the road. New drivers Gavin and Nick have already been slotted into the bus roster. As experienced heavyvehicle drivers, they are both now helping get our students safely to school and home again each day. Xavier too has joined our team. As a vehicle mechanic, he will have an important role in ensuring the serviceability of our growing vehicle fleet.

NEW SCHOOL BUS PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF ZONE!

With Glen St now closed to traffic in order to accommodate school-expansion projects, the school bus pick-up and drop-off zone has been moved around the corner to Osmond St. Osmond St is at the northern edge of the school boundary. This new zone is expected to be permanent. Future works are planned to ensure a space suitable for safe bus movement and student-passenger egress.
